APPROVAL OF PROPOSAL FOR CHANGE TO THE CROSSRAIL CENTRAL OPERATING SECTION (CCOS) NETWORK CODE

- The Office of Rail and Road (ORR) has today approved a Proposal for Change (PfC) to the Access Dispute Resolution Rules (ADRR) appended to the CCOS Network Code, which was submitted to it by Rail for London Infrastructure Limited (RfL(I)) on 14 November 2022.
- 2. This proposal amends Rule B4B of the CCOS ADRR to recognise that arbitration is the default approach where the parties to a CCOS access dispute are unable to agree an appropriate forum for dispute resolution. The proposal also makes changes to the CCOS ADRR to maintain consistency, where relevant, with the Network Rail ADRR following the approval of Network Rail PfCs 114-116.
- 3. ORR has reviewed the consultation responses received, which suggested some modifications to the PfC. The approval of the PfC is consistent with ORR's section 4 duties.
- 4. In accordance with Condition C2.5 of the CCOS Network Code, the amendments shall have effect 14 days from the date of this notification.
- 5. In giving RfL(I) notice of approval ORR also copies this letter and attached notice to all parties identified under Condition A4.1 of the CCOS Network Code.
- 6. A copy of this letter, the approval notice and a marked up copy the CCOS ADRR, showing all the proposed changes, will be placed on the ORR website. A copy of the approval notice will also be placed on the ORR's public register.
